A LEGACY OF HELPING OTHERS

Good ideas usually have humble beginnings, often born of necessity or accident, but they always seem to endure. United Midcoast Charities (UMC) was one such good idea.

UMC began on August 27, 1942, in response to the war's impact on the Midcoast community. Concerned citizens saw that by combining their efforts, they could raise the necessary funding to keep the helpers afloat.

We're proud to stand here today and say that the original vision is firmly intact as we celebrate an amazing 80-year legacy. That vision proved vitally important during the recent pandemic and afterward, as we face an out-of-control housing market, growing inflation, surging domestic violence, and troubling behavioral trends within our youth population.

In the face of it all last year, UMC supported more than 35 agencies, making a difference in thousands of lives. Put another way, the agencies we fund now touch one in three residents in Knox and Waldo counties.

The list grows every year, but here are just a few of the highlights from 2022:

- 36 individuals transitioned to stable housing thanks to Knox County Homeless Coalition.
- 6 new homes were completed by Midcoast Habitat For Humanity.
- 17 at-risk youth or teen parents earned their high school diplomas at Wayfinder Schools.
- 1,967 low-income children and adults received high-quality dental care at Knox Clinic and Waldo County Dental.
- 2,750 emergency shelter bed nights were provided to victims of domestic violence by New Hope Midcoast.
- 2,380 in-home healthcare visits were provided by Rockland and Camden Area District Nursing and Belfast Public Health Nursing.
- 44,339 meals were provided by Belfast Soup Kitchen and 39,586 meals were served by MCH-Meals On Wheels. (And, yes, the numbers are correct!)

This isn't just our story. It belongs to the entire Midcoast community... to the agencies providing so many essential services for those in need and to the donors who give so generously. Thanks to everyone involved, the good being done here has a long history and a bright future.

80 YEARS OF IMPACT IN MIDCOAST MAINE

1942: THE BEGINNING

United Camden Charities founded

In 1942, six organizations (Camden Community Hospital, Camden Red Cross Workroom, Camden District Nursing Association, Milk Fund YMCA, and the Boy Scouts) came together as United Camden Charities in urgent need of help, raising \$5,569 that first year (the equivalent of \$101,171 in 2022).

1949:

United Camden Charities changes name to United Camden-Rockport Charities.

1997:

United Camden-Rockport Charities changes name to United Mid-Coast Charities (UMCC) to "more accurately reflect the geographical area served by the charity," to now include all of Knox and Waldo counties.



2016:

Community Investors of Knox County founded with United Midcoast Charities as fiscal agent.

2017:

UMCC designated as a "2017 Top-Rated Nonprofit" by Great Nonprofits, the leading provider of user reviews of charities and nonprofits and has retained this status since.



2018:

UMCC announces new name, United Midcoast Charities, along with renewed Vision and Mission Statement: Identifying needs. Supporting solutions. UMC energizes Midcoast Maine nonprofits through finance and guidance, supporting a network of resources stronger than any single organization.



2019:

United Midcoast Charities receives "Gold Seal of Transparency" from GuideStar, a leading source of information about nonprofit organizations, and has since been upgraded to the highest level, Platinum status.

2020:

United Midcoast Charities creates a "Rapid Response Fund" to provide fast-turnaround, emergency funding for agencies reeling from the extraordinary and unexpected impacts of the pandemic.

2022:

United Midcoast Charities celebrates its 80th Anniversary, awarding more than \$500,000 in grants to more than 35 agencies serving the needs here in Knox and Waldo counties.

2022 IMPACT

- **17 at-risk youth and teen parents** received high school diplomas through the Wayfinder Schools Passages Program.
- **238 residents of Knox County** received domestic violence screening, support and resources.
- **28 people trained as facilitators** in restorative justice practices.
- **1,784 vulnerable community members** in Knox County and 1,300 in Waldo County received safety-net health within their home.
- **2,129 students and 90 school professionals** in Knox and Waldo counties received access to sexual violence prevention programs and trauma-informed responses.
- **101,847 hot, nutritious meals** were provided throughout Knox and Waldo counties, including homebound seniors, veterans and disabled adults.
- **425 Knox and 95 Waldo County residents** received hot, take-out-style meals five times a week.
- **15,672 visits to receive shelf-stable food**, fresh fruits and vegetables, paper and hygiene products in Knox County.
- **465+ Knox and Waldo county families** enrolled in weekend meals programs.
- **2,185 Knox households** received much-needed home energy assistance.
- **624 households** received firewood to heat their homes.
- **6 new homes completed** for low-income individuals and families in need.



2022 IMPACT

- **106 individuals transitioned** to stable housing.
- **1,885 days of transitional housing** provided for youth.
- **600 Waldo County folks in need** received pads, tampons, toilet paper and bladder pads.
- **297 LGBTQ+ youth supported** by programs that provide connection, support, and adult mentors.
- **79 individuals struggling with addiction** provided with a healthy and safe living environment.
- **280 students learned "soft skills"** for employment, including leadership, fellowship, working through adversity, taking one for the team, cooperation, reaching a seemingly unreachable goal.
- **720 youth and their families** received mentoring and family support in Waldo County.
- **1,967 low-income children and adults** in Waldo and Knox counties received high-quality, affordable dental care.
- **107 criminal cases referred** for community-based restorative justice support.
- **28 individuals trained** to provide coaching for organizations serving re-entry citizens.
- **697 residents at the end of life**, their families, and the bereaved provided with non-medical support.

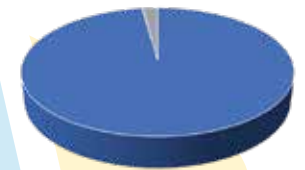

 Fiscal Year January 1 thru December 31, 2022

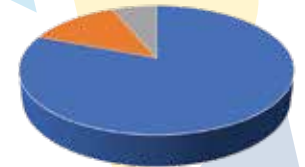
