Workplace Giving Profile

Fisher Engineering Employees Support UMC

Whenever it snows, we know at least 65 of our donors are smiling. They're the employees at Rockland-based Fisher Engineering who regularly donate to UMC through the company's Workplace Giving program. They know that 100% of their contributions go directly to 50 local nonprofits in their own communities. Since the company launched the payroll giving program in 2009, more than \$280,000 has been donated, thanks to the generosity of hard-working FISHER® employees and a dollar-for-dollar company match.

Area residents are used to seeing bright yellow FISHER® plows on trucks throughout Knox and Waldo Counties as they help clear local roads and driveways. Like UMC, Fisher Engineering was started in the 1940s, and workers still manufacture the equipment at the Rockland facility.

Dean Fisher founded Fisher Engineering in 1948 and decades later it is now one of the leading U.S. manufacturers of snow and ice removal equipment.

Dean earned degrees in civil engineering and mechanical engineering. During his World War II commission in the U.S. Navy, he worked with a Seabees construction battalion and served as second in command at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii. Shortly thereafter, he set out to build his snowplow business from the ground up. The original intent was to locate in Boston, but after visiting Maine, he fell in love with the area and based it here.

Today, Fisher Engineering, now a part of Douglas Dynamics, is a thriving facility employing about 350 proud Mainers. UMC appreciates its dedicated employees who are making such a positive difference in our local communities.

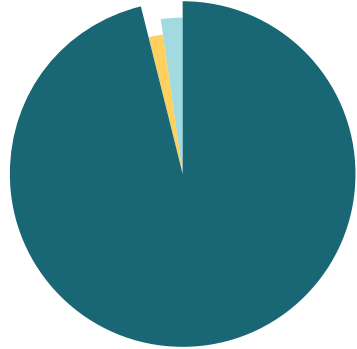

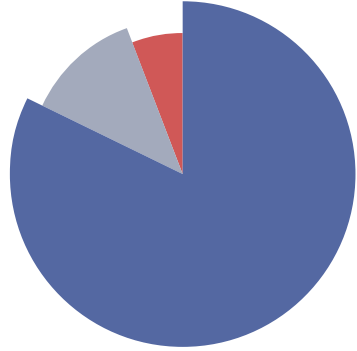

Establishing a Charitable Trust or Annuity

→ Creating a charitable remainder trust or gift annuity enables you to provide lifetime income for yourself and/or others.

A Matching Donation from Your Employer

→ Many companies offer matching gift programs to encourage employees to make charitable contributions. Ask your employer today.

IRA Charitable Distribution

→ You may give up to \$100,000 to charity directly from your individual retirement account (IRA) when you are over age 70½ without counting the distribution as taxable income. This type of charitable gift is called a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD).

Donations to UMC's Endowment

The UMC Endowment covers all our operating and fundraising costs, making it possible for 100% of all other donations we receive to go directly to the agencies.
