#### Wilbur K. Frost

CAMDEN — Wilbur K. "Jack" Frost, 67, husband of Zillah (Betty) Frost, died Oct. 24 at Pen Bay Medical Center after a brief illness.

He was born in Jamestown, N.Y., the son of Harold I. and Mable Schermerhorn Frost. He moved to India with his Baptist Missionary parents and received most of his elementary education there. Returning to this country at the age of 12, he resided at a missionary children's home in Newton Center, Mass. Following the closing of the home during the Depression, he moved to Granville, Ohio.

He was a 1936 graduate of Granville High School and a graduate of Dennison University in Granville. In 1940 Frost began graduate school at George Williams College in Chicago where he studied until entering the U.S. Army.

The Frosts were married Feb. 18, 1944. In 1947, Frost began his career with the Marshall Field Company of Chicago. Moving to Indianapolis in 1948, he became art director for the William H. Block Company in 1950. Frost returned to Chicago and worked with the Stubbs and Montgomery Advertising Agency there until forming his own agency (Jack Frost Studio of Chicago) in 1968.

From 1968 to 1970 Frost operated antique, stamp and coin shops under the name of Jack Frost Studio in Chicago and Wheaton, Ill. He was the 1970 president of the Chicago Chapter of American Stamp Dealers Association.

Moving to Maine in 1972, Frost operated Jack Frost Studio on Bay View Street until 1974. Semi-retiring that year, he concentrated on the painting of original watercolors which he continued until his recent hospitalization.

Besides his wife of Camden, he is survived by three sons, Jeffrey C. of California, Michael A. of Illinois and Jack D. of Wisconsin; a daughter, Jinnie Edwardson of Michigan; a brother, Dr. Robert A. of West Forks, a sister, Eleanor F. Michaels of Lewiston; and eight grandchildren.

A memorial service was held Tuesday from the Camden Congregational Church with the Rev. Archie McRee officiating. Arrangements for the Burpee-Strong Funeral Home, Rockland.

### ON VIEWING

Viewing the body of the deceased can serve an important function for the survivors, according to studies done by a number of respected social scientists. Though it is true that there are elements of disguise in the preparation of the body for the funeral, these efforts are no more the basis of the funeral ceremony than the use of cosmetics or a veil is the basis for a wedding. Rather, the attempt to conceal the ravages of suffering or trauma are only an attempt to facilitate a rather positive part of the ceremony. Viewing the person as best remembered can help move the grieving survivors

along from a shocked denial of the death to a recognition and possible final acceptance of it.

In the same light, the other parts of the funeral service all have their place and importance. People gather together, acknowledge the death, share in the grief, participate in the mourning rites, and witness the final disposition of the body.
