**Camden-Rockport Chamber Singers To Present Advent Concert Sunday**

An Advent Concert will be presented by the Camden-Rockport Chamber Singers on Sunday, December 9, at 4 p.m.

Nelson Monteith, vocal music teacher at Camden-Rockport High School, will direct the Chamber Singers. Janice Parkinson, director of music at St. Thomas Church, will be the organist.

The vocal portion of the Advent Concert will conclude with three Spanish carols: Two, "E la Don Don" and Riu Riu Chiu. The third, "Torches," is arranged by John Joubert.
